

What is my Summary Care Record (SCR)?

Your SCR is separate from your health record and is created nationally. It contains key information including your contact details, NHS number, medications and allergies, and it can be viewed by GP Practices, hospitals and ambulance services.

With your consent, additional information can be added to create an Enhanced Summary Care Record. This could include your care plans, which will help to ensure you receive the appropriate care in the future. Care professionals will ask for your permission to view your SCR. If you do not want a SCR please obtain an opt out form from: www.nhs.uk/nhsengland/thenhs/records



Sharing Your Health Record

Did you know that you are in control of who has access to your health record? We want to help you understand what this means and help you make a decision about sharing your health record.



What is my health record?

Your health (medical) record contains clinical information about the care you receive from any NHS service. The phrase 'Shared Record' is also used sometimes as well.

When you need medical help it is essential that any NHS service can securely access your health record. This allows them to have the necessary, complete information about your medical background to help them identify the best way to assist you.

Which services can access my health record?

There are a number of health and social services that need access to your medical records when they become involved in the provision of your care and treatment. This includes but is not limited to: GP referral to hospital or community services; or self initiated contact with urgent care, e.g. Salisbury Walk in Health Centre.

Local health and social services have already been verified, known as 'pre-verified services' to share your health record. These services have been summarised on the next page. However, you can also view these services using your online SystmOne account.

If you wish to add or remove pre-verified health and social services, please access your online SystmOne account. By removing a pre-verified service, clinicians requiring more information about your health will need to obtain your agreement before delivering care and treatment using a pass code. This verification process is also used for any other appropriate services not pre-verified by you or your GP Practice.

Where is my health record stored?

Your health record is held by your GP Practice on a secure computer system called TPP SystmOne. Your health record can be accessed by a range of NHS and associated care services.

Is my health record information secure?

Yes. There are safeguards in place to make sure only pre-verified services view your records. Any other services will require a passcode to access your health record.

You can also see who has accessed your information from both within and outside your Practice by using your online SystmOne account or by making a request in writing to your GP Practice.

What do I need to do now about sharing my health record?

1. Check the list of pre-verified services using your online SystmOne account, adding or removing the services according to your preference. Be careful about preventing services from accessing your health record completely.
2. If you don't yet have an online SystmOne account, please request a username and password at reception. To set this up you will need to show photographic ID.

Examples of pre-verified services

These services can access and share your health record. Care professionals will ask for your permission first:

1. Accident and Emergency departments across England
2. Palliative care services across England
3. Urgent care services in Wiltshire, e.g. Salisbury Walk in Health Centre
4. Local hospitals (Salisbury Foundation Trust, Great Western Hospital, Royal United Hospital)
5. Community services in Wiltshire, e.g. district nursing team, intermediate care

Do you share my anonymised data?
